Gary Myers, our Division Superintendent, brought in a D&RGW SD40T-2 in HO scale. This model of EMD's famous "tunnel motor" was manufactured by Athearn for the Rio Grand Modeling & Historical Society and is of #5370. The original locomotive was build in August 1975 and retired in 1995.





Another D&RGW model, this time of a box car in gold and silver livery, was Glenn Sponholtz's contribution. This O scale model is beautifully detailed and shows off the wonderful paint scheme.

Plans to involve more members in Division operations, such as committee chairs, clinics, and other activities, were related; and the need to develop a Division constitution and by-laws was highlighted.

MEETING PLACE


uring the last election, Aurora voters did not pass a bond issue that would have kept several libraries opened. Another consequence of this action was disbanding the office that scheduled the various meeting spots around the City. Because of this transition and the fewer number of meeting rooms, we lost out our

meeting space in the Aurora Municipal Building to a city group.

There are several options opened to us. We can continue to meet in the Aspen Room at the Aurora Municipal Building, but we'd have to change our meeting night to the third Thursday of the month. There may be other spaces available.

Until this all gets figured out—and possibly as the permanent solution—we will be meeting in the community room at Fire Station No. 2, I 2600 Hoffman Boulevard, Aurora, CO. Dick Hunter's map can help point the way.


Until further notice we will be meeting at that location. It
