AFSGSLA Club Events and Related Activities:

As with the last several newsletters, we are combining the planned club events and the other related activities. Although we will not necessarily participate in some of the following events as a club, they are included in this somewhat comprehensive listing for your information. We suggest you keep this newsletter for your future reference and attend our club meetings for full details.

Saturday, November 10, 2018: Dupo Train Show is where we will display our double helix layout. The show will be open to the public from 9 am to 2 pm, and you are asked to show up at 7:30 am to help **Barry Dolan** and the set up crew.

Saturday, November 17, 2018: Our club meeting will be hosted by **John and Wendy Schlum** at their home at 1337 Robert Ridge Drive St. Charles, Missouri from Noon to 3 pm. This will be the second time we will be meeting in their home and the last time we were really impressed with the extent of his collection. **John** was nice enough to adjust the date, to avoid a conflict with the Dupo Show.

Saturday & Sunday, November 24-25, 2018: Great Train Show: Collinsville (Illinois) Convention Center. AFSGSLA's Club Order of Special Cars:

As always, if you are interested in participating in these club orders, it would be to your advantage to attend the club meetings where details are made available and arrangements are finalized.
---The status of the Special Cars previously ordered is summarized as follows:

2017 TTOS Car: The notice for this 2017 TTOS car offering was just announced. (*Ed: What do you mean the 2017 Car? Oh, I remember this is from Lionel.*) It is an American Flyer by Lionel (**Limited Production**) Generator (or HEP) Car. It is attractively painted in Blue and Silver, the official colors of the Nevada State Railroad Museum. And it was proposed by the TTOS Silver State Division. The car is priced at \$64.95 each with shipping extra. TTOS is also offering these car as 3-pack and 6-pack sets. The club order was submitted on August 18, 2018.

2017 TCA Cars: This is the TCA 2017 offering, consisting of 3 different Lionel American Flyer S Gauge Cars. The first two cars are a P&LE Flatcar with Die-Cast Jeep Vehicle Load # 16001 & #16002. The postwar version of this flatcar was offered with plastic (editor's note: TCA wording, we all know better) abstract versions of this world-famous vehicle. To provide a unique car, this new version will feature scale 3/16" die cast vehicles. There will be two car numbers offered—16001 & 16002—available individually or as a set. Price was \$84.95 each or \$ 159.95 for the set of two. Shipping is included. The third car is a MTH S Harmony Creamery Reefer. The MTH offering is geared more towards the scale S collector and will have all the detail and scale features of its reefer predecessors. Price was \$64.95. The delivery of these units is now shown as October 2018.

2018 TCA Cars: The S Gauge car for 2018 is a Lionel Ben and Jerry's billboard Reefer. A single car sells for \$69.95, 3 pack for \$204.95 and a six pack for \$399.95. A note says that there are six different road numbers and SKU's. For the single and three pack, random non-duplicate numbers will sent, the six pack insures one of each. The order period is now over.

2016 S Fest Sprecher Rootbeer Reefer – SOON? These cars finally made it to the MTH shipping schedule. It shows October 2018.

2019 TCA Convention car - The only American Flyer S Gauge car is a White Sands Missile Range Flat. This is the basic postwar flatcar with two missiles, only decorated different. Two road numbers are available. If you order one car, you will get a random number. The two car set contains one of each number. Early Bird pricing ends on August 31, 2018. Early bird pricing is \$66.45 for a single car and \$123.45 for the two car set. After August 31, 2018, the cars are \$69.95 for a single car and \$129.95 for the two packs. End date for ordering is October 31, 2018.

This and That

Fall S-Fest 2018 report: The FSF-2018 is now history. Another great FSF held by the CASG (Chicago Area S Gaugers. This was the first time at this venue, Georgio's Banquets and Quality Inn and Suites in Orland Park, which is just slightly north of Tinley Park where previous FSF's were held. This was one, if not the best, places for a FSF in recent memory. The trading room itself was somewhat odd shaped which allowed for wide aisles as well as tables around the perimeter. It was extremely well lit, which is becoming much more important at our ages. As usual, there were lots of things to buy, with prices seeming to hold pretty well steady from last year. Hard to find items commanded an even higher price, while there were lots of bargains on the common items. There a couple of dealers who apparently did not get the memo that you can no longer charge \$25.00+ for a very common car in poor condition. As usual Gary Clark's museum filled a large part of one row. Don Heimburger and his multitude of tables was back after being gone last year due to **Don** being in Europe attending a book publisher's convention. My only disappointment with the trading room was that although there were several people selling parts, none of the big parts guys were there. I guess I have to break down and mail order them and pay the shipping. The 2018 cars by American Models were available for pick-up. There were lots of attendance prizes, raffle and auction items, of which I didn't win a single one, and yes I did buy raffle tickets. The clinics were excellent. Absent this year were the train races, and the incline challenge. Participation and attendance has been steadily dropping and it was decided it was time to give them a rest. The model contest had more entries than recent years. John Nossari took second place in the structures category with his engine house and I took third with a scratch built gas station. Joe McDoakes made his usual appearance. The banquet food was fantastic, with soup, salad, a plate of both chicken and beef, and a large bowl of pasta with lots of sliced Italian sausage was put on the table to be shared family style. Moe flirted with our server and he was the only one at our table who got two deserts. Next year's FSF-2019 will be hosted by us and the bar was raised quite high.

The Annual Fall S Fest-2019 (FSF-2019): Planning is now well underway for AFSGSLA to host the 2019 Fall S Fest. The steering committee is made up of Moe Berk, Charles Albietz, Charley Taylor, Vince Love, David Stone, Pete Mihelich, Paul Wehrle, Rick Archeski and Gary Mueller. The committee has now met several times and has made a number of accomplishments. A brief report was provided at the September meeting. The two big items are completed; the contracts for both the hotel and the meet cars have been signed. After the first of the New Year, work on the packet will begin.

Peter Mihelich is assembling the listing of volunteers and assigned tasks. As always, early volunteers get to choose their tasks while later volunteers are assigned their tasks.

Previously Published news from Lionel: Our good friend **Mark Hieger** recently reported on the new Lionel/American Flyer new numbering system being used in their latest catalog. **Mark** reports:

The new numbers are typically seven digit numbers. Most now begin with "19". That number is to represent the year of production as in 2019. The number does not reflect the catalog year...but rather when the item will be produced. (That sounds optimistic what with the long time between catalog appearance and delivery of some items). The second two numbers are the marketing category and for S scale the numbers used are 17-21, where: 17. Sets, 18. Track, 19. Rolling Stock, 20. Accessories, and 21. Locomotives.

Now, isn't that informative and helpful?

AND NOW FOR THE REST OF THE STORY TO FURTHER CONFUSE THE MATTER

As Mark reported above, the second two numbers represent the marketing category. There is an additional second two numbers in the marketing category that we may be interested in, 01 which denotes special non-cataloged items. Our Budweiser cars for the 2019 Fall S Fest are numbered 1901081 and 1901082. The O gauge 2019 Anheuser-Busch car for the St. Louis Lionel Railroad Club is 1901310, so the '01' as the second two numbers will not help us distinguish the scale.

Mark Twain Hobby Center: Our member **John Burke** made the initial contact with Mark Twain Hobby about their 10% discount program. We followed up with their Kevin, learned the program details, and enrolled the AFSGSLA members in that program. In summary, it is a 10% discount "across the board" program for all but a very few items they sell. Kevin told us that they limit their advertising through email and that each of you will receive an email with the details of their program.
