At present there is a G gauge train loop in operation and a couple railroad items. After the next WCGD meeting and the approval from the property owner on the wall treatments, we will start putting up S gauge and other railroad memorabilia items in these windows.

Former club member and long-time treasurer Jeff Young's estate is being dealt with by the BSG officers of our club. The club will be picking up a number of articles from his collection. Most will be S gauge but there will also be other gauge pieces. A method of purchasing some of these items will be noted in future newsletters or club emails. This will only take place after a total inventory is taken.

There may be some open houses down the road in connection with downtown Waukesha activities.

We are contributing along with the Gandy Dancer club to the Waukesha Downtown Business Association so we will be included with their announcements.

The modular layout will have a committee to oversee layout improvements. Eventually, we hope to decorate the current layouts for seasonal accents like Easter, 4th of July, Halloween, Christmas, etc.

## Clubhouse Clatter

So, what's happening with the Badgerland S Gaugers."

There is still no word on the BSG layouts move. The only indication is that it will be in the June or later timeframe. As previously noted, Ray Puls has been continually improving the trackwork. The Geezer gate was one of the major issues. Not only do the trains run pretty well over the gate module, but a safety switch has been added. It is hard to believe that in the past if an individual opened the gate the trains continued to run. Micro switches have replaced the solid brass contact surfaces and the track has been cut. The power to the track now shuts down eliminating the possibility of someone's train taking a deep dive off of the layout.

At the April 1<sup>st</sup> open house Tom Patterson once again ran his Maine Central A-B-A along with somewhere between 21 and 24 of really nice cars most of which were SHS. Considering the near demise of the modular layout, all of the trains, be they American Flyer or scale have run very smoothly over the layout. Derailments are now a thing of the past. Thank You, President Ray Puls, Secretary of BSG Transportation. Maybe he should go to Washington D.C., judging on how well they are doing.

Jim Maslowski ran his "War Train" This is the first time that I have seen it run. One of the really interesting features are the WWII military vehicles and equipment that are mounted to the American Models flat cars. It took some time for Jim to find his vehicles of choice. Of all of the freight trains that I have seen, his was one of the more unique and interesting, besides showing a bit of history.

The train is called a type B military train and consists of 14 cars including the caboose. Two Bx-38 box cars, a Pullman passenger car for the troop detail, 2-53-foot flat cars with Stuart tanks a gondola car featuring Harley-Davidson WLA motorcycles, seven 48-foot flatcars featuring 2-2.5-ton 6x6 trucks, 2-half-tracks, 2-Sherman tanks, 1-willys jeep with a 155mm gun, 2-truck ambulance, and 1-dodge ambulance car with a 76mm Sherman tank.

In all probability, the clubhouse will be open on Friday s evenings during the Friday Night Live season.

A couple newsletters ago I sent pictures of the window displays set up by the Gandy Dancers model railroad club. Since the move to the new location, they have gotten a handful of new members. This indicates, that in a short time, the display has been beneficial. BSG is hopeful that when we get more information and S gauge displays in the window, we might get and bump in our membership. BSG currently has 32 paid memberships.

## **BSG Layout Progress**

The main reason for even having a clubhouse is to have a place to run trains. As with all layouts they are never finished. We realize that there may be some members that may not be able to attend meetings or run trains on the layouts. In saying that, at least you should know what is happening at the club house. The newsletters will be including various pictures of the progress on the layouts. In addition, we want our membership know what is planned in the future. It is also hoped that the photos might encourage members to offer suggestions regarding what they feel would be great additions to the layouts.

Ron Schlicht, the clubs answer to Plasticville historian, has been detailing the structures that he donated to the club. The tabletop layout is being spruced up. All of the Plasticville buildings have been detailed and have movable attached scenery. Every building is done in a modular fashion and the layout can be totally rearranged if desired, in a very short period of tame. Future plans are to once again take a smaller version of the layout to various venues as we did in the past.

As most know I have almost everything that Bachman made in original Plasticville. Collecting mint items in crisp original packaging is for many individuals, but not for me. Many of you know that Bachmann was very savvy as to how Plasticville was marketed. It was colorful and easy to assemble for small children. The other marketing prowess was the packaging, which read O-S on the boxes. This translated to slightly smaller than Lionel and slightly bigger than American Flyer, the two main toy train manufactures of the time. It was kind of like baby bears porridge, just right or as referred to on the Monte Python show "Brilliant".

Never does anything on my layout end up in original condition or untouched by a paint brush. Here is an example of what will be on the tabletop layout. The PV greenhouse, at one time, was considered a rare item, actually they can be purchased at a very reasonable price. The one below was made from a number of somewhat imperfect parts. I might add this was one PV item that could not be assembled by a small child. As noted, all of the scenery and parts are on a thin sheet of styrene and can be picked up and moved to a new location on the layout. There was not a penny spent for this small venue. All of the items were things that have been laying around in my basement for years, or made from "stuff". Eventually we will have to add some consumers
