January 21st Meeting Report

President Ray Puls opened the meeting.

Roy Meissner gave the positive treasurer's report.

Old Business:

- 1. Ron Schlicht reported that the thought of the Gandy Dancers club to replace all of the existing carpeting was cancelled because of the fear of asbestos tiles underneath. Both clubs will fill in some uncarpeted areas, primarily along the walls, with trimmed carpet tiles.
- 2. Ron Schlicht also reported that the tabletop (Flyer-Plasticville) layout will be put back up when a refrigerator is moved from the area. BSG still has to move our storage cabinets and other supply bins to the new storage area.
- The subject of a summer picnic was brought up and member in attendance unanimously expressed that they would be interested in attending if one were held.
- 4. Our possible future 2025 Fall S Fest was discussed. The help from the State-Line S Gauge club was mentioned again, and our BSG club will investigate a location.

New Business:

- 1. Member Wayne Friedrich offered the MSOE picnic grounds for an August 11, 2024 BSG picnic. These grounds near Jackson, WI, have the elaborate 7-1/2" gauge setup that folks can ride on. The club tentatively accepted the offer.
- 2. A tentative OK was voted on for the August 11, 2024 BSG picnic at the MSOE location. This is ideal for BSG members and families. It's a good

place for kids, grandkids and us older kids to go and enjoy.

- 4. There was not a membership list distributed in 2023 A 2024 membership roster will be published soon after the annual dues is collected.
- 5. Financial matters regarding our non-profit status, club assets and insurance matters were discussed. After the passing of our treasurer, Jeff Young, some of the details fell through the cracks and have to be resolved
- 6. Until we get our modular layout back together and get the tabletop layout re-installed there probably won't be any public open houses. The HO club has repositioned potions of their layout and have a substantial area that is in operation. It appears that the final floor plan has been approved this will involve a huge expansion.
- 7. Upcoming shows were talked about including the MAD CITY show on Feb. 17 and 18, the Spring S Spree on May 3 and 4 in the Cleveland area, and the NASG Annual Convention on July 17-21 in Harrisburg, PA.

Fall S Fest By Ron Schlicht

Just some final thoughts on Fall S Fest. Gone are the years of over 600 attendees, gone are the days of 200 vendor tables. Gone are the days of selling over 500 Fall S Fest cars. (In 2000, BSG sold out, 525 cars, before the convention even started.) Gone are the days of having more than enough help for all of the tasks that are required. Worst of all gone are some of the familiar faces. Those individuals who never missed the event and will never make one again.

As I looked around the room most of the familiar faces were that of the vendors. Some of the prices, particularly Lionel American Flyer were astounding. Astoundingly low, on new in the box 80's and older. Everyone who bought in those later year cars has one and there are not enough people that don't already have one.

As much as S Fest is supposed to encompass all of S Gauge, it is still dominated by A.C. Gilbert American Flyer Trains, admittedly it's still *FLYER FEST*. This is the reason there is a diminishing return on investment for the sponsoring organizations. 1967 spelled the death of Gilbert trains. This makes almost all of Flyer enthusiasts eligible for Social Security and there is not a lot of room for a train layout in a condo or an elder care facility.

In saying all that the Badgerland S Gaugers are on the docket for sponsoring Fall S Fest 2025. That is unless we can't find enough club members to help out. Some of the key positions may not be available anymore. Facilities are also a big issue. Many of the newer hotels do not have large enough conference rooms or tables available for vendors. Hotels in the area have many requirements for the amount of room reservations. Banquet costs are getting out of hand and there are a lot of contingencies attached to use their menus and facility. BSG paid dearly for that the last time we hosted the event. Holding an event at a hotel, although convenient, may be economically out of our reach. Needless to say, BSG hosting Fall S Fest is presently in question. Facilities and membership participation in order to hold this event are the primary issues
