
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10 December 2011 The 2800 Class, construction continues.





The Goods Shed at Mosquito Flats is alive with activity prior to arrival of the next goods train



The young lady with the bucket in hand, Mrs Hilda Garde, is in fact the Overseer to the man with the broom, Mr Grandon Godley [the Janitor].















