

The BTR – Devil's Pinch Station

Devil's Pinch gets its name from a palm tree that was at this site and that had long sharp thorns. As distinct from a geological 'Pinch' that is a tight squeeze, mountain pass, narrow cliff ledge etc etc..

The model was made from styrene profiles, that were glued onto a plywood core.
