

Local Railroad Books By Arlyn Colby

The Blueberry Line was a Soo Line Railroad that ran from Ridgeland to Dallas, Hillsdale, Barron, Cameron, Rice Lake, Campia, Mikana, Angus, Birchwood, Edgewater, Signor, and Reserve, WI. This book tells the story of this popular branchline railroad that served Barron, Washburn, and Sawyer Counties. 180 high gloss pages include 191 black and white pictures, 12 color pictures, 38 maps, 121 charts, letters, diagrams, etc., plus the full history of this nostalgic line.






The Mondovi Line is the story of the Omaha Railroad that ran from Fairchild, WI to Osseo, Strum, Eleva, and Mondovi. This line was abandoned in 1975 and is now an all-purpose trail. This 148-page book contains 109 black and white pictures, 4 large color photos, 120 diagrams, blueprints, letters, reports, etc. and well as the history of this neat branchline railroad.

The Milwaukee Road's Chippewa Valley Line was built in 1882. The southern terminus was Wabasha, MN and the railroad crossed the Mississippi on a unique pontoon bridge. Towns served on the line included Durand, Red Cedar, Meridean, Caryville, Lufkin, Shawtown, Eau Claire, Chippewa Falls, Dunnville, Downsville, Irvington, Menomonie, and Cedar Falls.
