

The Annual Meeting of the Nutmeg Division will be held on Sunday March 14, at 1:00 PM at Elaine's Restaurant, 1841 Berlin Turnpike, Wethersfield, CT. We will have a happy hour from 1 until 2, be served our meal from 2 until 3, and have our business meeting from 3 until 4. This will allow most people to drive home in daylight.

There will be a choice of three entree's: Boston Scrod sprinkled with bread crumbs and baked with lemon and butter; Chicken Marsala, chicken sautéed with mushrooms, prosciutto, Marsal Wine in a brown sauce; New York Sirloin Steak, a choice 12oz sirloin steak grilled to perfection. MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

December 12, 2003

A small contingent of Nutmeg Division members attended the first Friday evening meeting held in the meeting room at the Wethersfield Police station. The location is very comfortable. Members agreed however that it is not prudent to schedule a meeting between Thanksgiving and Christmas since many people have so many obligations at this time of the year.

Bob Van Cleef presented an informative clinic about the history, preparation and exchange of railroad passes. Bob displayed a variety of passes for the attendees to view. Bob stated he has issued, collected and exchanged hundreds of passes. Those he displayed illustrated that passes can and do take many forms. The issuance of model railroad passes started around 1950. Passes can be traded via email after they have been viewed at a modeler's internet site. Pass forms are limited by the preparer's imagination. One type is the business card-shaped CD-Pass which may include information about a layout including pictures, music, track plans as well as a text description of the railroad. Bob gave the attendees a detailed insight into another aspect of model railroading, pass collection.

January 09, 2004

On a chilly Friday evening, 31 members of the Nutmeg Division braved the elements to attend the membership meeting. Again the meeting again was held in the meeting room at the Wethersfield Police Station. The original plan was to have Davies present a clinic on the construction of dioramas. He was, however, unable to make the presentation on the scheduled date. We became aware of the problem too late to inform the membership. Bob Welk, Jr. agreed to make a presentation on incredibly short notice (two days). He provided a very informative slide show about contemporary railroading in Great Britain.

Bob, assisted by his dad, Bob Welk, Sr., also displayed models of British rolling stock and photo albums of British trains. The presentation included slides of antique equipment and the countryside interspersed with the slides of rolling stock. This allowed the viewers to get a better understanding of unfamiliar areas. Photos displayed equipment in Wales and Scotland as well as England. The presentation gave members an understanding of the railroad transportation network throughout the Great Britain. We don't realize how provincial we have become in America until we have the opportunity to see how things are done in other countries.

The division owes a dept of gratitude to both Bob Welks, Jr. and Sr. to provide us with a very pleasurable evening. The Nutmeg Division hopes to reschedule the diorama presentation.
